Along with Speech and Occupational Services from Northern Wells Community Schools, the following ladies are also volunteering their services to our students:



We had another successful Summer Reading Program at the Wells County Public Library with 1745 children and teens registering! The program includes children from birth to age 18. Children from kindergarten to sixth grade win prizes by tracking how many minutes they read. Cumulatively they read over 489,000 minutes. Teens record pages read. They totaled over 711,000 pages. The library staff is proud of these young people and this program, which encourages reading during summer break.

Proof of income and household size will need to be included, such as your 2024 federal tax return showing Adjusted Gross Income and household size. Please contact the school office if you have any questions.

This scholarship is a donor based assistance that will be determined by how much is in the fund in order to equally distribute. If assistance is not what you need and you'd like to help another student by donating to this fund, go to www.lutheransgo.org.

We walk around with our phones in front of our eyes, earbuds stuck in our ears, or something always playing in the background. But all the noise of our world can drown out the most important sounds: the Word of God and the prayer and praise of His people. In contrast to the noise of the world, the Psalms call us to lift up our voices in confession, proclamation, and worship.

Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises! (Psalm 98:4). Our theme for the 2025–2026 school year is “Make a Joyful Noise!” There's really only one thing we can do in response to all that the Lord has done for us: praise Him! Our God created us, redeemed us by the blood of Jesus, and is constantly at work in our lives by the Holy Spirit. As we say in the Small Catechism: “For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.” At Bethlehem Lutheran School, the worship of the Holy Trinity is at the center of our life. 

BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN CHURCH & SCHOOL LIBRARY POLICIES

Library Purpose

The purpose of the library is to supplement classroom learning and provide motivation for reading enjoyment. Visiting the school library helps students learn the basics of library use and etiquette.

Circulation Policies

Kindergarten students may have a maximum of one book checked out, loaned for one week.

1st - 8th grade students may have a maximum of two books checked out, loaned for two weeks.

Books may be renewed a maximum of two times (i.e., three weeks for Kindergarten students, six weeks for other students) and **the book must physically be in the library to be renewed**. If a book is not returned by its due date, fines will accrue at a rate of \$0.25 per item per week.

Due dates and a maximum checkout exceptions may be made for book reports, research reports, and other classroom assignments, at the discretion of teachers and/or librarians.

Lost or Damaged Books

Parents will be notified when a book is overdue. If an overdue item is not returned within four weeks after parents are notified (or by the library deadline at the end of the school year) the item will be considered lost and a replacement fee will be charged. A handling fee of \$5.00 will be added to the cost of the book replacement.

Librarians should be notified of any damage that occurs to a library book. If a damaged item needs to be replaced due to inappropriate handling or accident (i.e. water damage), a replacement fee may be charged. A handling fee of \$5.00 will be added to the cost of the book replacement.



The church has long struggled with how to respond to suicide. Early Christians, facing brutal persecution, sometimes sought death as escape or even as a form of martyrdom. To curb this, the Early Church issued edicts condemning suicide, but instead of offering comfort to the despairing, it stigmatized and judged them. Sadly, echoes of this remain today, where some Christians insist suicidal thoughts reflect weak faith or a lack of trust in God. Meanwhile, modern secular culture presents what seems to be a gentler alternative—empathy that validates the choice to die. Yet this “death culture” equates hope with independence, and when independence fails, hope collapses. Instead of restoring life’s meaning, it celebrates death as a dignified solution, offering only a false compassion that ultimately abandons the suffering.

In contrast, Christian hope is rooted not in independence but in Christ. Depression and despair may convince someone life is worthless, but the Gospel proclaims that worth and dignity come from Jesus’ death and resurrection. In Baptism, Christians already experience a “beautiful death”—dying to sin and rising to new life in Christ. This means that even in weakness, frailty, or deep suffering, believers are not left without purpose or value; their life remains secure in God’s hands. True compassion, then, is not in affirming a choice for death but in walking with the despairing, pointing them to the Savior who promises, “I give them eternal life, and no one will snatch them out of my hand.” Christian hope does not glorify a “beautiful death” of human choice, but a beautiful life given daily through Christ, who sustains His children until He Himself calls them home.

Because of this, the church is called not to condemn or dismiss those wrestling with despair, but to meet them with the hope of Christ. By listening, praying, and reminding them of their baptismal identity as God’s beloved children, Christians can offer real comfort that neither suffering nor suicidal thoughts define them—Jesus does. In Him, even the faintest flicker of faith is guarded, nurtured, and made alive with the promise of eternal life.






